49ERS RETURN HOME TO HOST PRINCETON, HAWAII THIS WEEKEND

The Long Beach State women's soccer team is looking to bounce back from a pair of tough road losses as it returns to the friendly confines of George Allen Field for two non-conference matches this weekend. The 49ers are slated to square off against Princeton Friday (Sept. 2) at 5 p.m., before entertaining Hawaii on Sunday, Sept. 4, at 1 p.m.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

Princeton, which began its fall camp on Aug. 19, is set for its season opener at George Allen Field on Friday. The Tigers finished the 2010 season with a 9-6-1 overall record and advanced to the Ivy League championship game. Princeton returns its top two point scorers from that squad in Jen Hoy (6 goals, 7 assists) and Caitlin Blosser (7 goals), along with goalkeeper Kristin Watson, who compiled 62 saves and a 1.09 goals against average.

A GLANCE AT HAWAII

Hawaii (0-3) is searching for its first win of the season as it heads to UC Irvine (Sept. 2), before making its way to Long Beach. Last weekend, the Rainbow Wahine fell to North Dakota State, 3-2, and California, 3-0, at the OHANA Hotels and Resorts No Ka Oi tournament. Brittani Lum is tops on the squad in goals (2), points (4) and shot attempts (5), while Rachel Domingo has assisted on two of Hawaii's three goals. Kanani Taaca has started every game in between the posts, registering 10 saves.

SERIES RECORDS

Long Beach State is tied in its all-time series with Hawaii, 2-2-1, and has won the last two meetings. Most recently, the 49ers earned a 4-3 overtime victory in Honolulu on Aug. 27, 2008. This will mark the first meeting between LBSU and Princeton.

LAST TIME OUT

Long Beach State came up short in a tough road trip as it went 0-2 at the Milwaukee Cup in Wisconsin. The 49ers suffered their first loss of the season in a seesaw battle at Milwaukee last Friday. Nadia Link was quick to get LBSU on the board, registering her first goal of the season just three and a half minutes into the game. Shawna Gordon found Link inside

**HEAD COACH
MAURICIO INGRASSIA
Eighth Season**

Long Beach State soccer has risen to new levels under eighth-year head coach Mauricio Ingrassia, winning the program's first Big West Tournament championship in 2010, claiming an unprecedented three consecutive conference regular season titles from 2006-08, and making the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearances in 2008 and 2010.

Ingrassia has compiled an impressive 78-48-16 overall record in his seven years at the helm. He has led the 49ers to a Big West title in four of the last five years. During that span, LBSU has posted a 24-12-3 mark (.615) in conference play.

After being picked to finish sixth in the 2010 Big West Preseason Poll, the 49ers exceeded expectations, claiming the program's first Big West Tournament title and advancing to the NCAA Championships for the second time in the last three years. LBSU tied the school's win record, finishing with a 14-6-2 overall mark and was second in the Big West regular season standings at 5-2-1.

In 2008, the 49ers went 14-5-4, tying the single-season record for wins, while also establishing school records in goals (44), assists (37), points (125) and shots (326). The record-breaking campaign, which saw Long Beach State go undefeated in league play at 7-0-1, culminated in the program's third-straight Big West regular season title, its first at-large bid to the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Championship and its first appearance in the conference tournament finals.

In 2005, the nation's 15th-ranked recruiting class quickly paid dividends, going 12-5-3, as Bolt was named the Big West Conference's Co-Freshman of the Year and joined Kim Silos as a freshman All-American, firsts for the LBSU program, as were the national and regional rankings during the season.

A year older in 2006, the squad broke the school record for victories in a season, going 14-5-1 and winning the franchise's first Big West regular season title. LBSU also established itself in the top 25, remaining there for a good portion of the season. The defensive unit ranked 19th nationally in goals against average (0.64).

In 2007, the 49ers won their second consecutive Big West title after posting a 5-2-0 mark in conference action. Despite outshooting Cal Poly 21-to-3 in the Big West Tournament semifinals, the 49ers fell by a single goal.

Prior to Long Beach State, Ingrassia won five state titles at Long Beach City College, the most by any coach in California history (1997, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003). The Vikings finished the season ranked in the nation's top five in five of his final seven years, including a No. 1 ranking in 2002 and 2003. Overall, Ingrassia went 184-24-8 (.870), and ended on a 55-game unbeaten streak which began in October, 2001. From 2000-03, the Vikings went an astounding 95-3-1 (.965), starting with a 25-2-0 record in 2000, followed by marks of 24-1-0, and 24-0-1. In 2003 they went 22-0-0.

LBCS won five South Coast Conference titles (1997, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003), and made the playoffs eight times. The Vikings earned their first playoff berth in school history in 1996.

Ingrassia graduated from Cal State Fullerton in 1995 with a degree in psychology and earned his master's at Azusa Pacific in 1998. He has one daughter, Madison.

the box who then dribbled past Milwaukee's diving goalkeeper to score on an open net. The Panthers then came back to take a 2-1 lead before the break. The 49ers would even it up in the second period when Link sent a cross from the left wing to Kelsey Wilson, who headed the ball to the far post in the 71st minute, but Milwaukee answered just over eight minutes later to come away with the 3-2 victory.

Two days later, Long Beach State was back on the field at 12th-ranked Marquette. The Golden Eagles held an early 1-0 advantage before Link tied it up in the 39th minute with a header off a free kick from Alex Balcer. The home team eventually netted the game-winner at the 67:42 mark and held on for the victory.

49ERS IN THE RANKINGS

LBSU, which was ranked 23rd in the first Soccer America poll, released Monday, Aug. 22, dropped out of the rankings after falling to 2010 NCAA Tournament teams Milwaukee and Marquette. As of last week, the 49ers were also ranked sixth in the West Region.

BACK ON TRACK

Coming off a breakthrough season in which she scored a team-high eight goals, junior forward Nadia Link proved she is back where she left off as she leads the 49ers in nearly every offensive category. Link has compiled two goals, two assists, six points and eight shot attempts in four games. She was named to the Milwaukee Cup All-Tournament Team after playing a part in all three of LBSU's goals (2 goals, 1 assist).

GORDON IN COMMAND

Midfielder Shawna Gordon is off to a stellar start in her senior campaign. Gordon registered two goals in the 49ers' first weekend of action, connecting for the game-winner in the 86th minute to give LBSU a 2-1 upset win over No. 25 USC, and netting the second goal in a 3-0 victory over Sacramento State. In her three-plus year career, Gordon has 12 goals, which puts her just one shy of breaking into the program's all-time top 10 list. She is also tied for fifth in assists (15) and is eighth in points (39).

WARM WELCOME FOR WILSON

Sophomore midfielder Kelsey Wilson has made an immediate impact in her first season at Long Beach State. Wilson had an assist in a 3-0 win at Sacramento State and scored her first career goal as a 49er at Milwaukee.

STROZIER STRIKES AGAIN

Senior Jazz Strozier played a big role in LBSU's win over Sacramento State. She netted the game-winning goal at the 3:46 mark, and just under four minutes later, she set up Shawna Gordon to give the 49ers a 2-0 cushion. It was Strozier's third career goal and second game-winner at Long Beach State.

DEFENSE ON OFFENSE

Long Beach State's back line has not only excelled on the defensive end, but it has also provided a

good chunk of the 49ers' offense. Junior Alex Balcer scored her first career goal at then No. 25 USC, while finishing with an assist at 12th-ranked Marquette. Nicole Hubbard also found the back of the net against Sacramento State.

GUSTAVES IN GOAL

After being a backup goalkeeper for three years, senior Kaitlyn Gustaves shined for the 49ers in her first weekend as a starter. After LBSU took a late 2-1 lead at then No. 25 USC, Gustaves made two dazzling saves in the final seconds. The Long Beach native had a diving stop on a point-blank shot toward the right post and then knocked away the rebound attempt at the buzzer. Two days later, Gustaves picked up her first shutout with two saves on six shot attempts against Sacramento State. She also compiled a career-high seven stops at No. 12 Marquette. On the season, Gustaves is 2-2 with 15 saves and a 1.50 goals against average.

LBSU SECOND IN BWC PRESEASON POLL

Long Beach State was picked to finish second in the Big West Conference Preseason Coaches Poll. The defending Big West Tournament champions received 70 points, coming in behind preseason favorite UC Irvine (78).

SISTER ACT

Long Beach State has three sets of siblings associated with the team this year. Junior Alex Balcer's younger sister, Lara, transferred to Long Beach State after redshirting her freshman year at Stephen F. Austin.

Jordan and Taylor Nelson also join the 49er family in 2011. Jordan is a junior transfer from Loyola Marymount, while Taylor is an incoming freshman from Pacifica High School.

Junior Shannon Bullock's older sister Lindsay, who was a two-time Big West Midfielder of the Year, remains with the program as an undergraduate assistant coach after completing a stellar four-year career in 2010.
